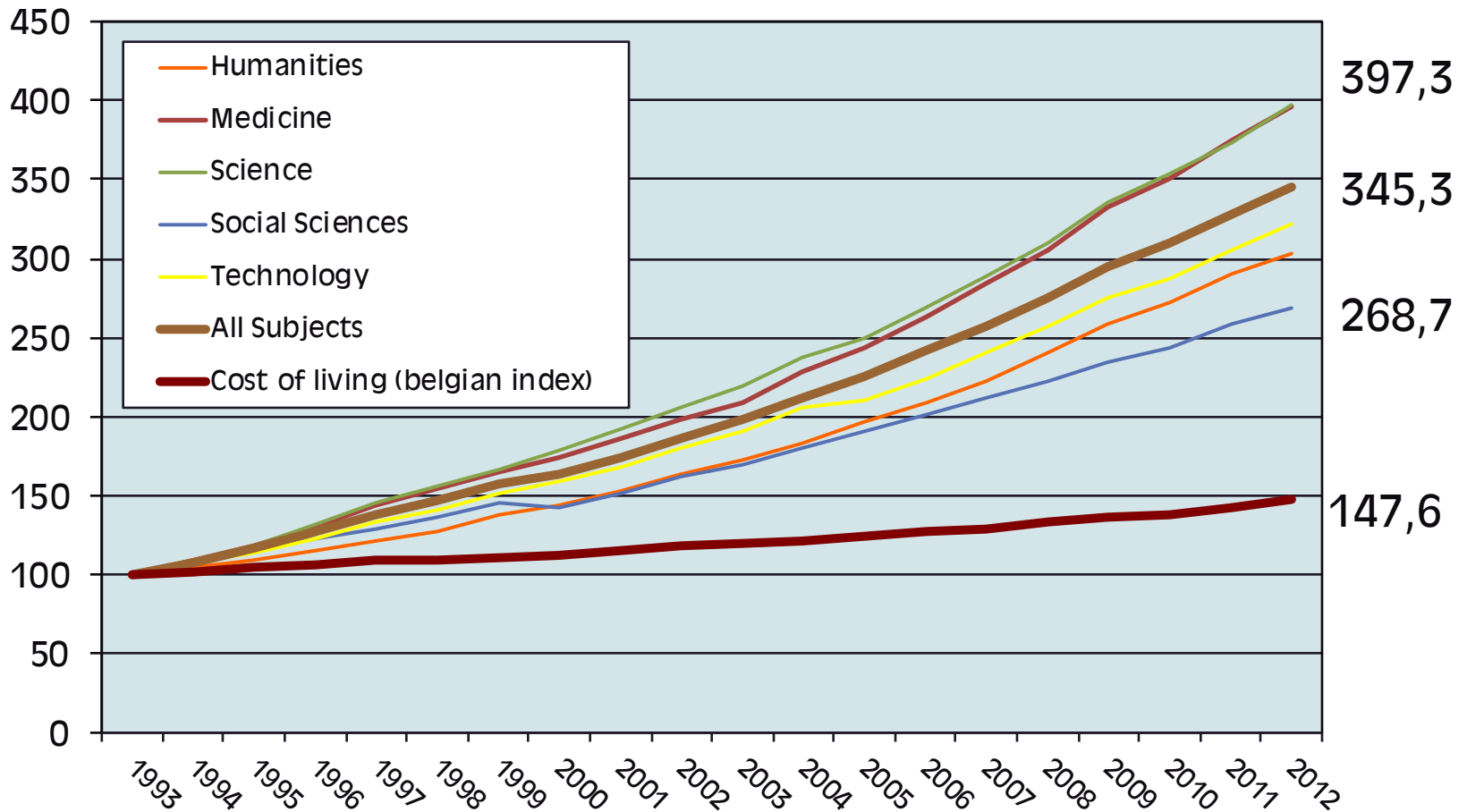

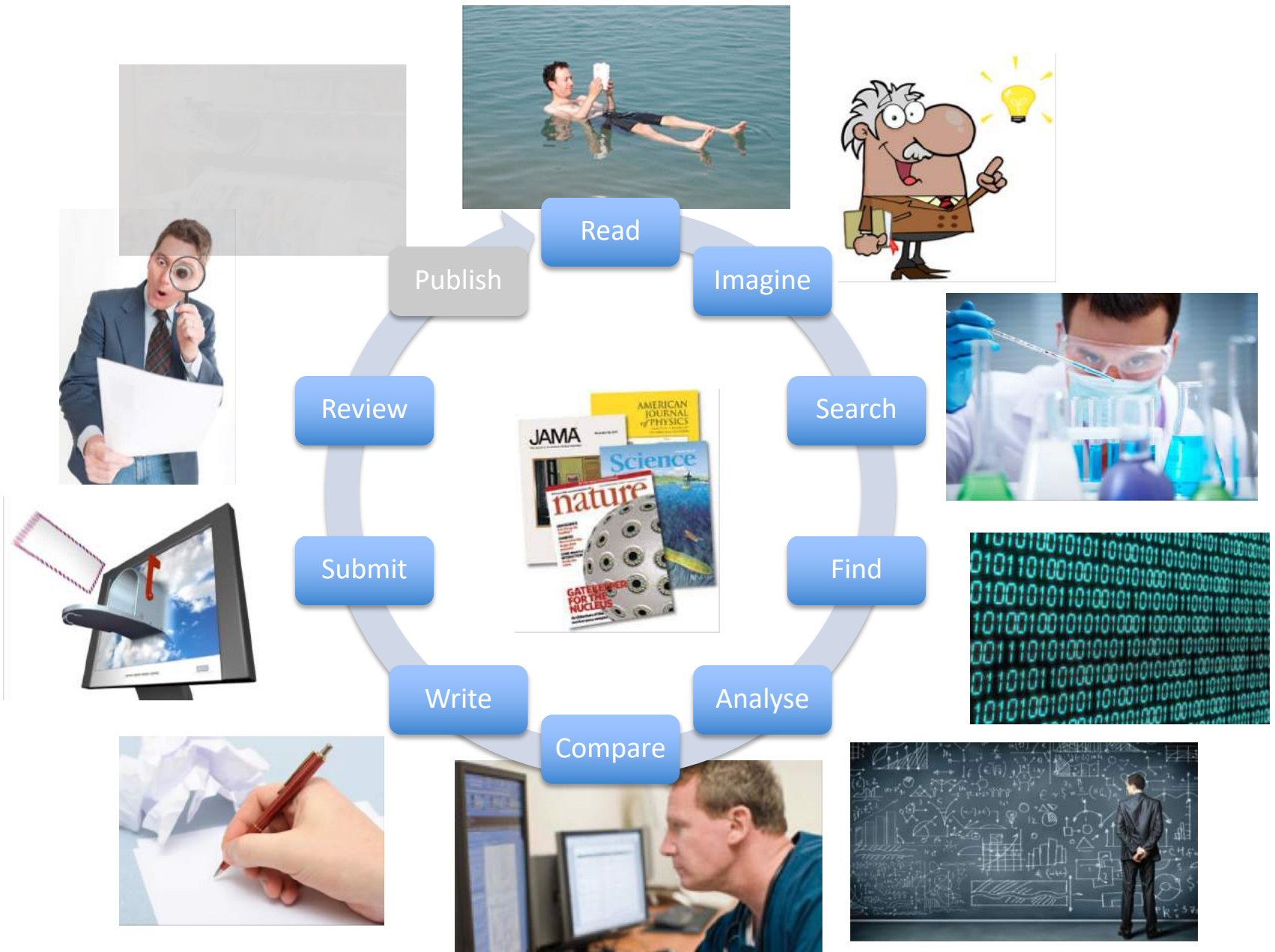
**Serials price increase compared to the evolution of the cost of living



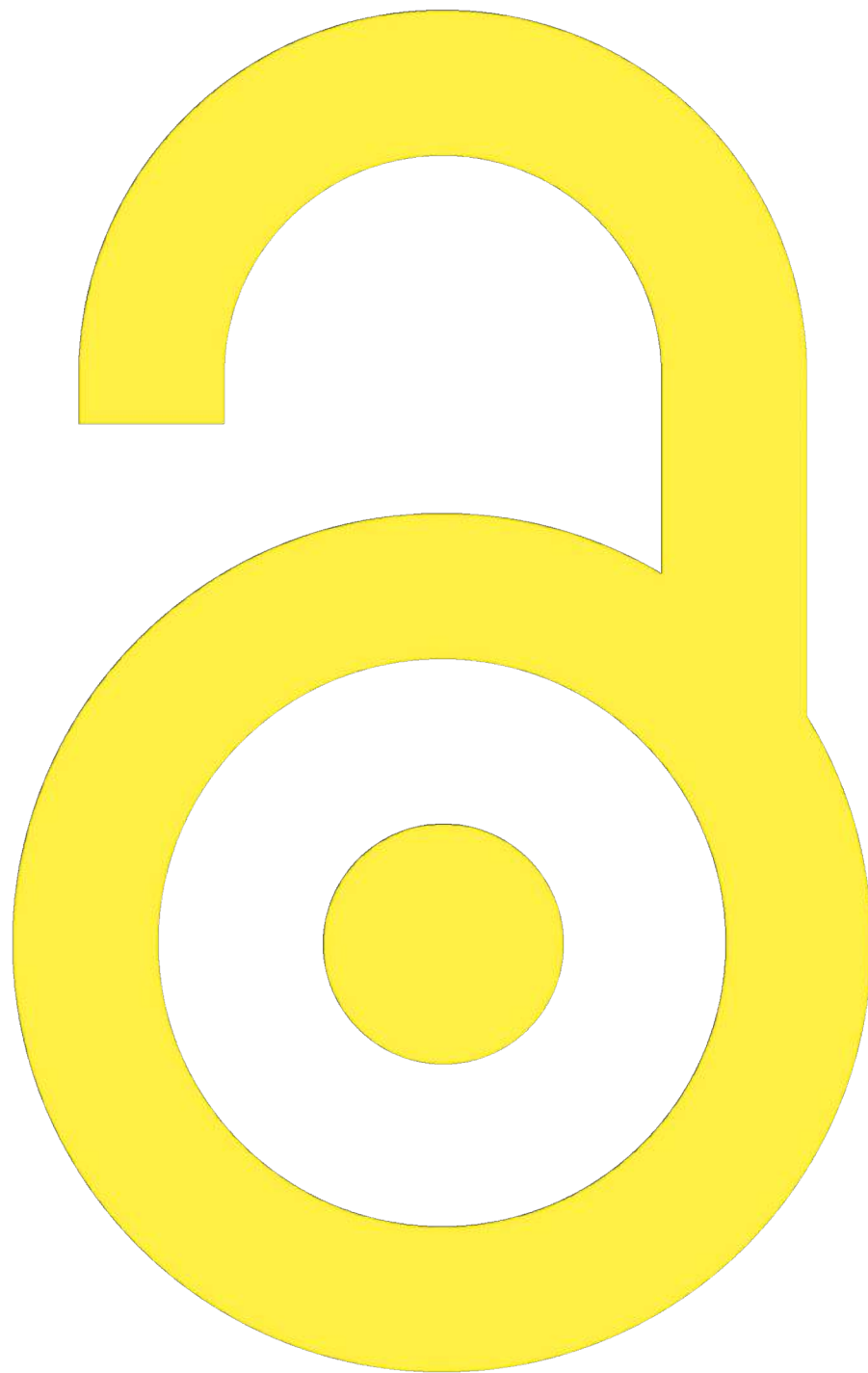

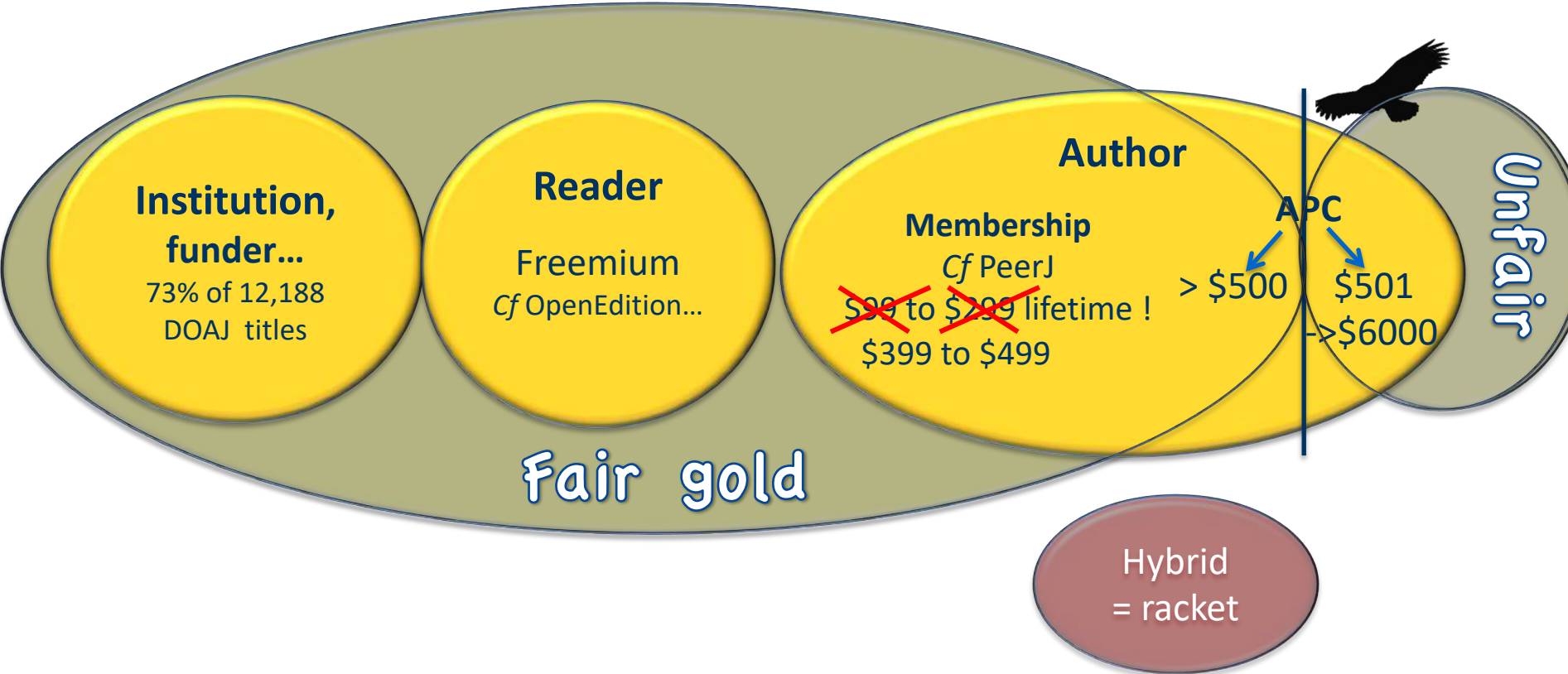

[PoPuPS](#) (Portail de Publication de Périodiques Scientifiques) is a portal which allows journals editors from the University of Liège to publish easily and quickly their journals in Open Access. By this way, the visibility of research publications and the reputation of the journals are wider and improved. Next to the online version, each journal may still be published in print format. So, PoPuPS is a project which is alternative and complementary to commercial initiatives.

[PoPuPS](#) is based on partnership : the University of Liège Library develops the platform and acts as a technical support for journals editor. Since editorial independence is guaranteed, each journal remains fully responsible for the content and the diffusion of the articles.

[PoPuPS](#) respects international OAI standards. Its content is interoperable with similar foreign initiatives and therefore integrated into a large international network.

In January 2015, the Université Saint Louis de Bruxelles joined the [PoPuPS](#) portal, by integrating several of its journals.

Since spring 2018, the Royal Belgian Academy also publishes the journal La Thérésienne via [PoPuPS](#)

Scientific Context:

[PoPuPS](#) is one of the initiatives of the University of Liège Library to promote open access to scholarly communication. Among other initiatives, let's mention ORBi, the open access institutional repository.

Indeed, the aim of the scientific community is indeed not to guarantee financial incomes to commercial publishers, but to allow a quick and large spreading of their researches while authors keep their right to be acknowledged for the works they publish.

So researchers have the responsibility to take control again on the scholarly publication process with the help of new technologies. In this regard, libraries have an important role to play: since they have always been specialized in giving access to information, they have to put their expertise at the disposal of scientific communities in order to develop and maintain new diffusion supports and new ways to have access to free information.

Résumé

Cet article vise à analyser les difficultés de l'intégration régionale en Amérique Latine et en particulier le cas du Mercosur. Il montrera que le régionalisme ne s'est réellement développé qu'après la guerre froide, à une période qui coïncidait avec la dominance du Consensus de Washington, ce qui a signifié l'abandon des politiques d'industrialisation basées sur la substitution aux importations. Le contexte économique global a renforcé la spécialisation des économies du Mercosur et celles du reste de l'Amérique Latine dans le rôle de fournisseurs de matières premières et de produits agricoles. Cela a engendré une plus grande instabilité macroéconomique de ces économies et de plus grandes tensions entre les pays membres du Mercosur. Cela a également affaibli la capacité du lobby industriel d'influencer les politiques économiques. La faiblesse relative de l'industrie dans cette région explique pourquoi la régionalisation générée par la dynamique microéconomique des firmes sera plus faible qu'au sein d'autres processus d'intégration régionale tels que l'UE, l'ALENA ou l'ANASE pour lesquels cette dynamique joue un rôle décisif.

Abstract

This article will look at the structural difficulties that regional integration faces in Latin America and in particular will analyze the evolution and prospects of Mercosur. It will show that regional integration could only fully develop at the end of the Cold War but this period coincided with the adoption of the Washington Consensus and that meant that the largest Latin American economies renounced to a substantial part of their import substitution industrialization policies. The global economic context reinforced the specialization of Mercosur and the rest of South American economies on commodities and energy sectors. This has generated a higher macroeconomic instability and more tensions between the member States of the Mercosur. It has also weakened the lobby of industrialists in shaping economic policies. The relative weakness of the industry in this region explains why the enterprise-driven regionalization will be weaker than in other regional integration processes such as the EU, NAFTA or ASEAN where it played a decisive role in the deepening of the economic integration.

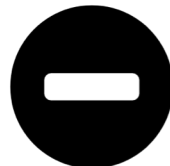

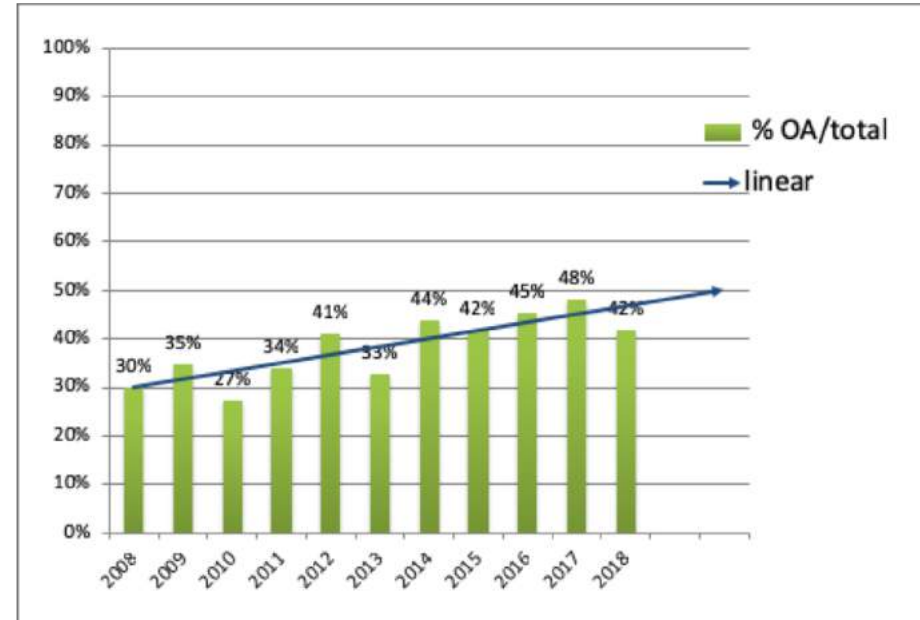

Part of references added **in OA** by year

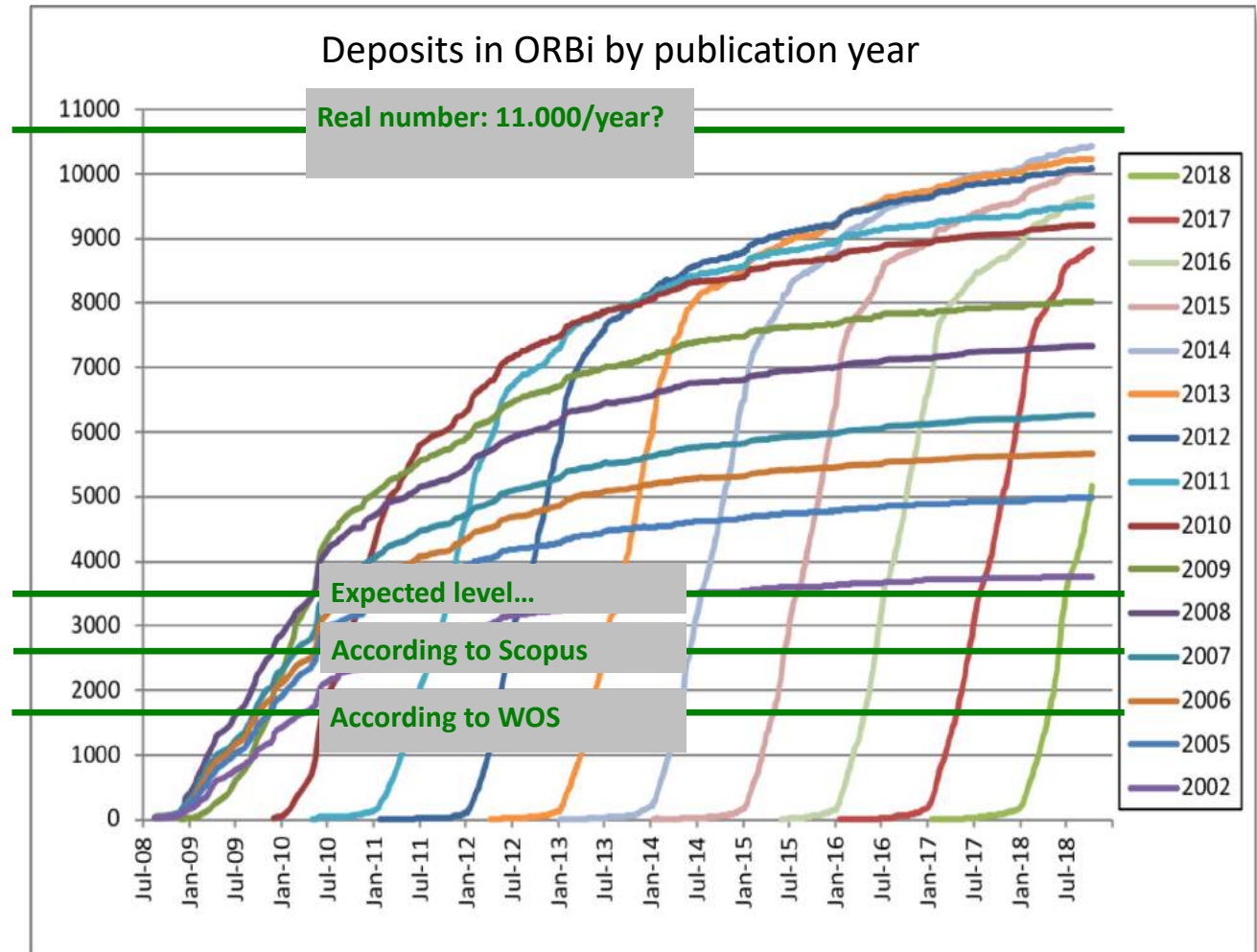

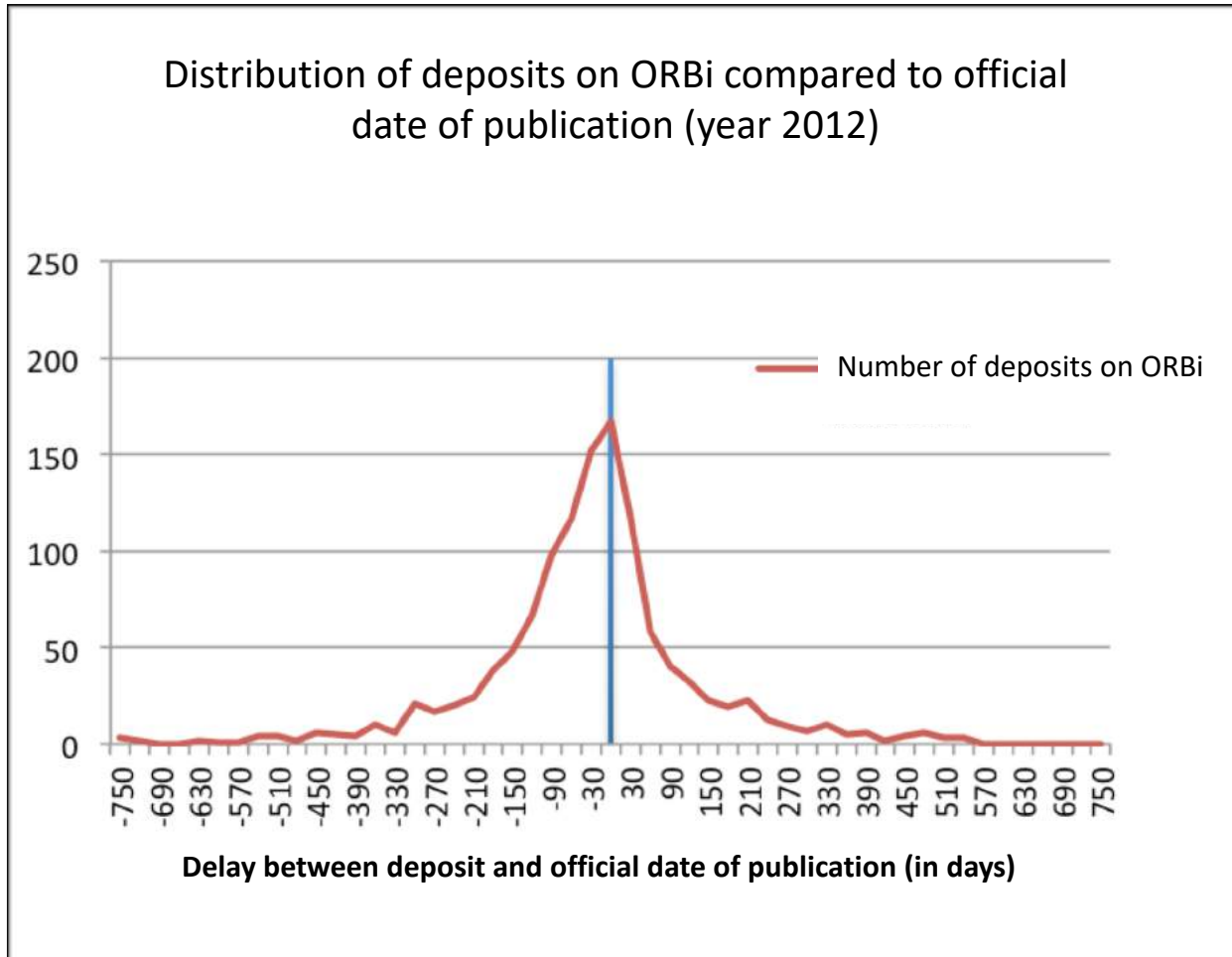

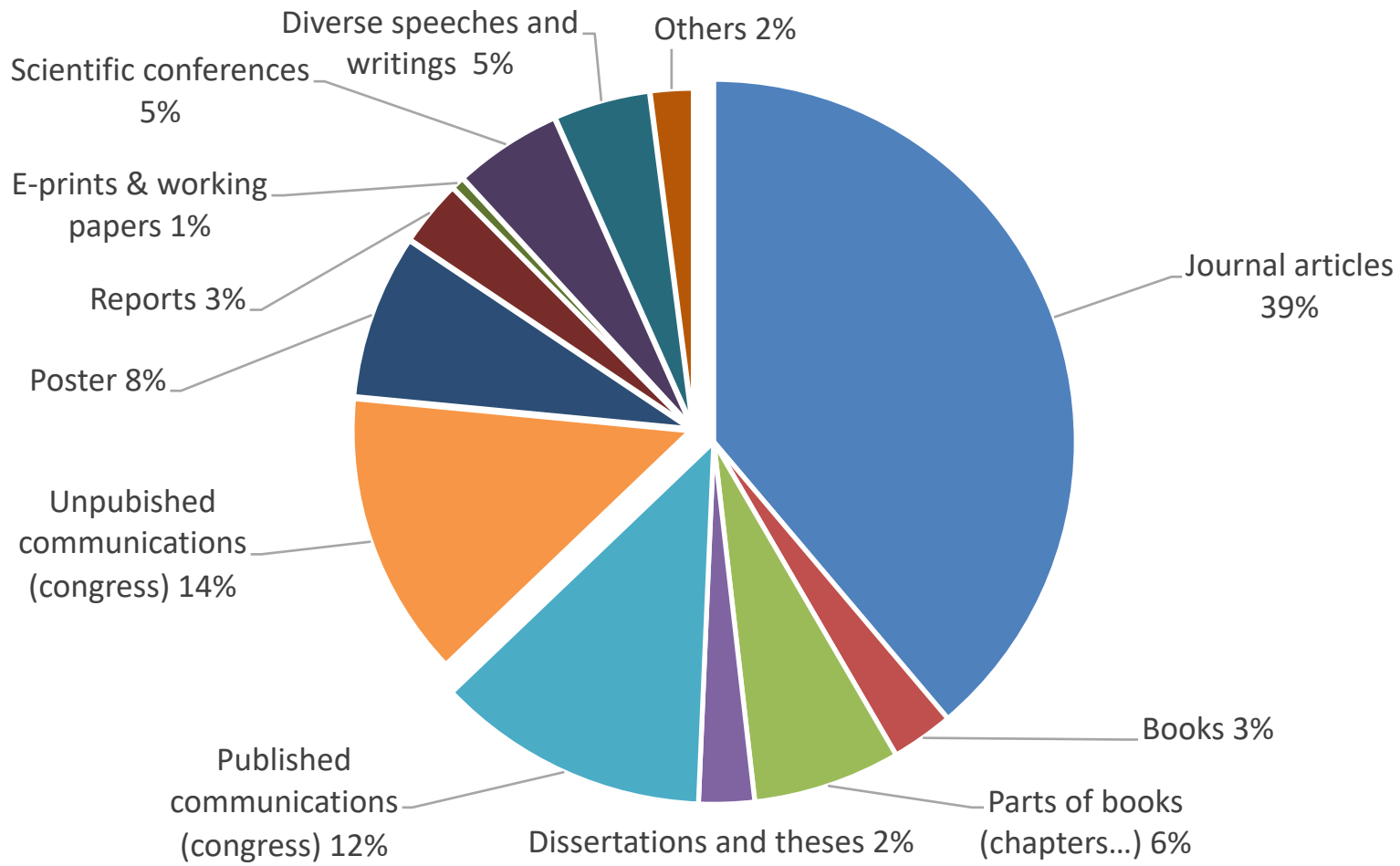

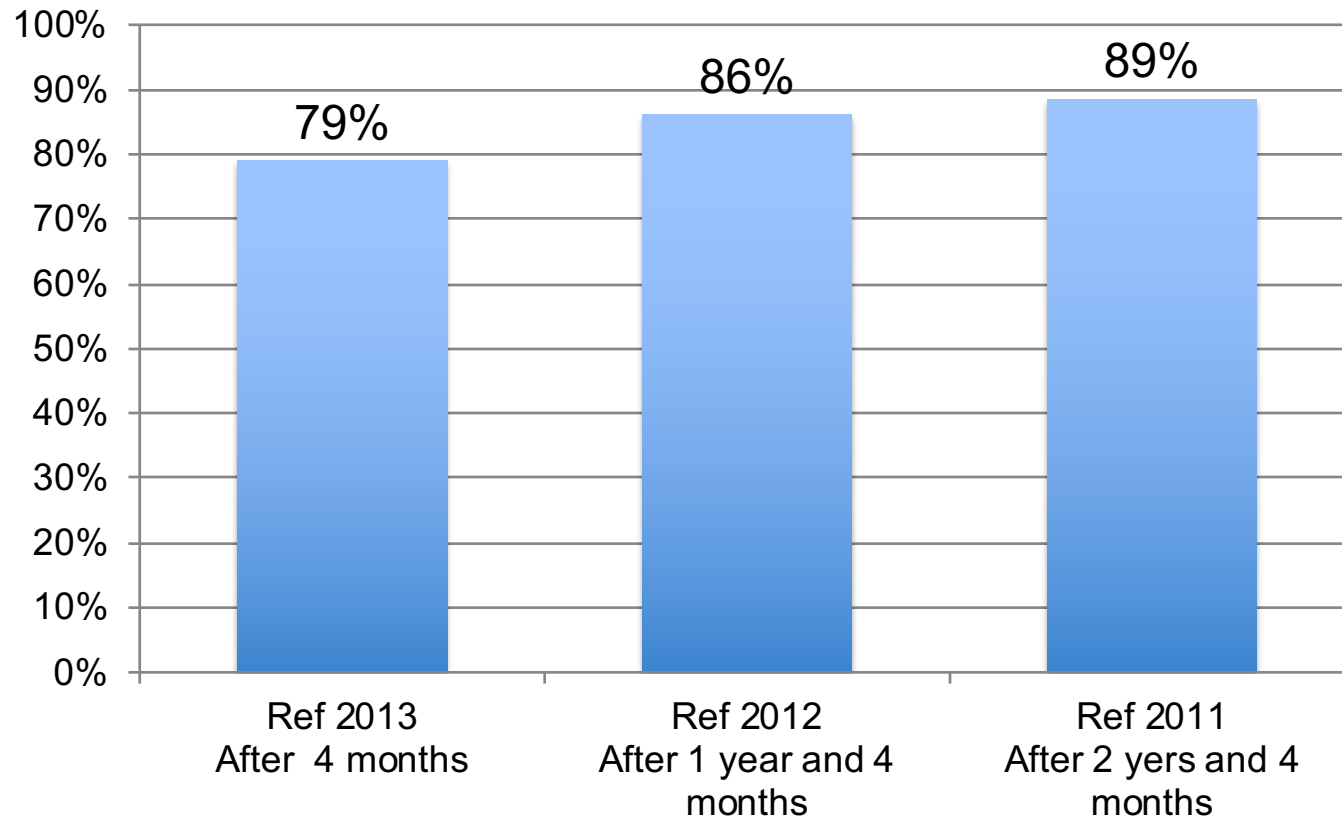

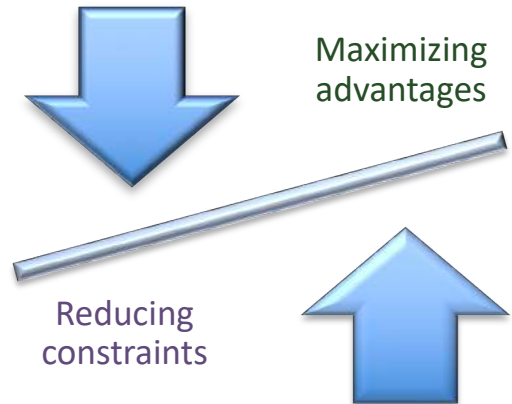


Stick effect?

- ▶ At the beginning, probably!
- ▶ **But not after: maximizing advantages:**
« *Sweat once, win many times!* »

=> Benefits for the author

- Long term **preservation**
- **Increased Visibility!**
- Automatic **improvement** (IF, citations...)
- **Added values:** links from phonebook, dynamic reports, widget, institutional reports, integration with national funder F.R.S-FNRS, request à print...


Gravitational Lenses

EASO

In 1979, three British-American astronomers, Walsh, Carswell and Weymann discovered by chance in the sky the example of a gravitational lens mirage, an illusion at the cosmic scale, which consists of two images of a background quasar (an active galactic nucleus), formed by a gravitational lens in the foreground. The formation of cosmic mirages had been predicted within the general relativity developed in 1917. According to this theory, E predicts that light rays emitted by a distant background source are deflected near a heavy and compact foreground massive object (the lens) located along the line of sight, like a star, a galaxy or even a cluster of galaxies. The large concentration of mass may act as a kind of lens, called a gravitational lens.

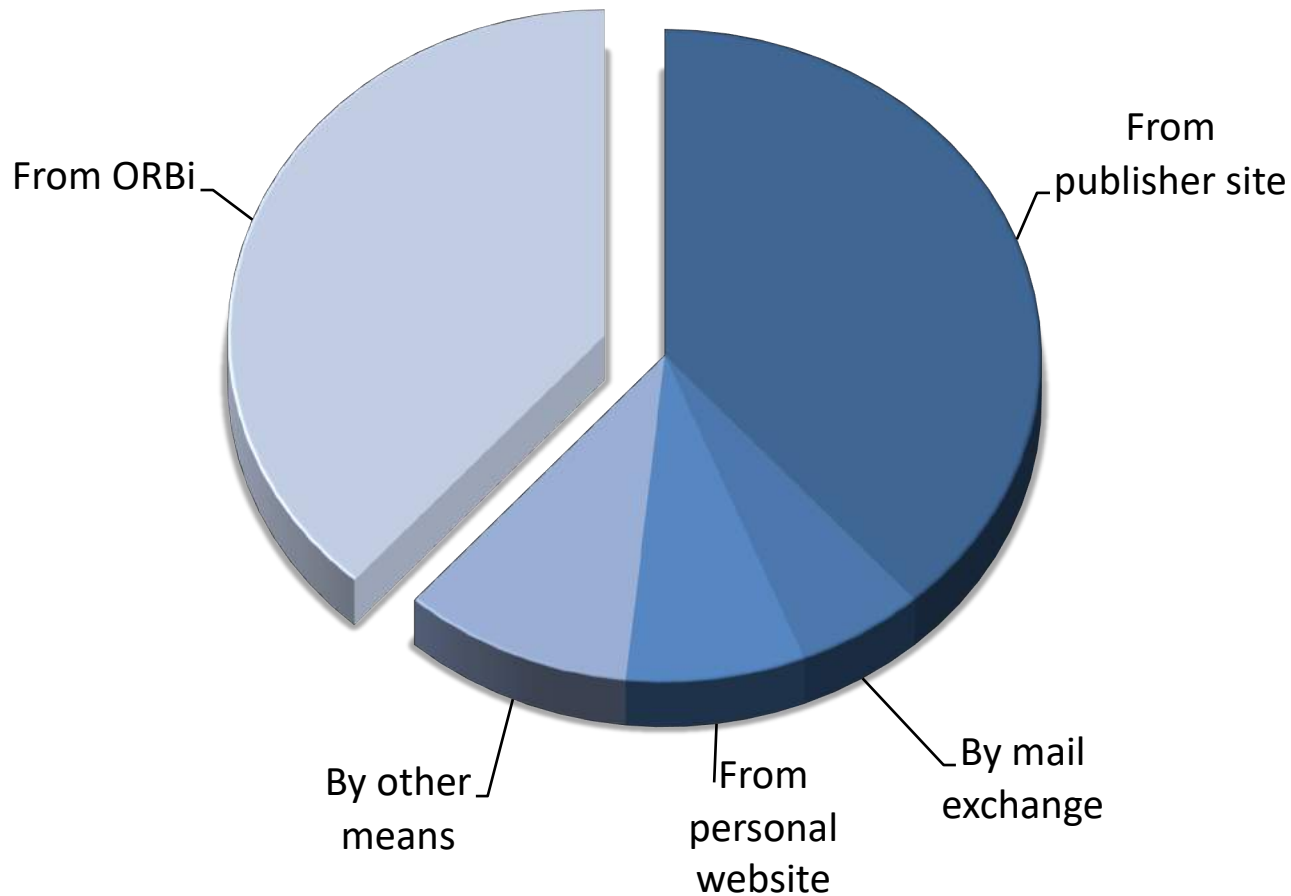

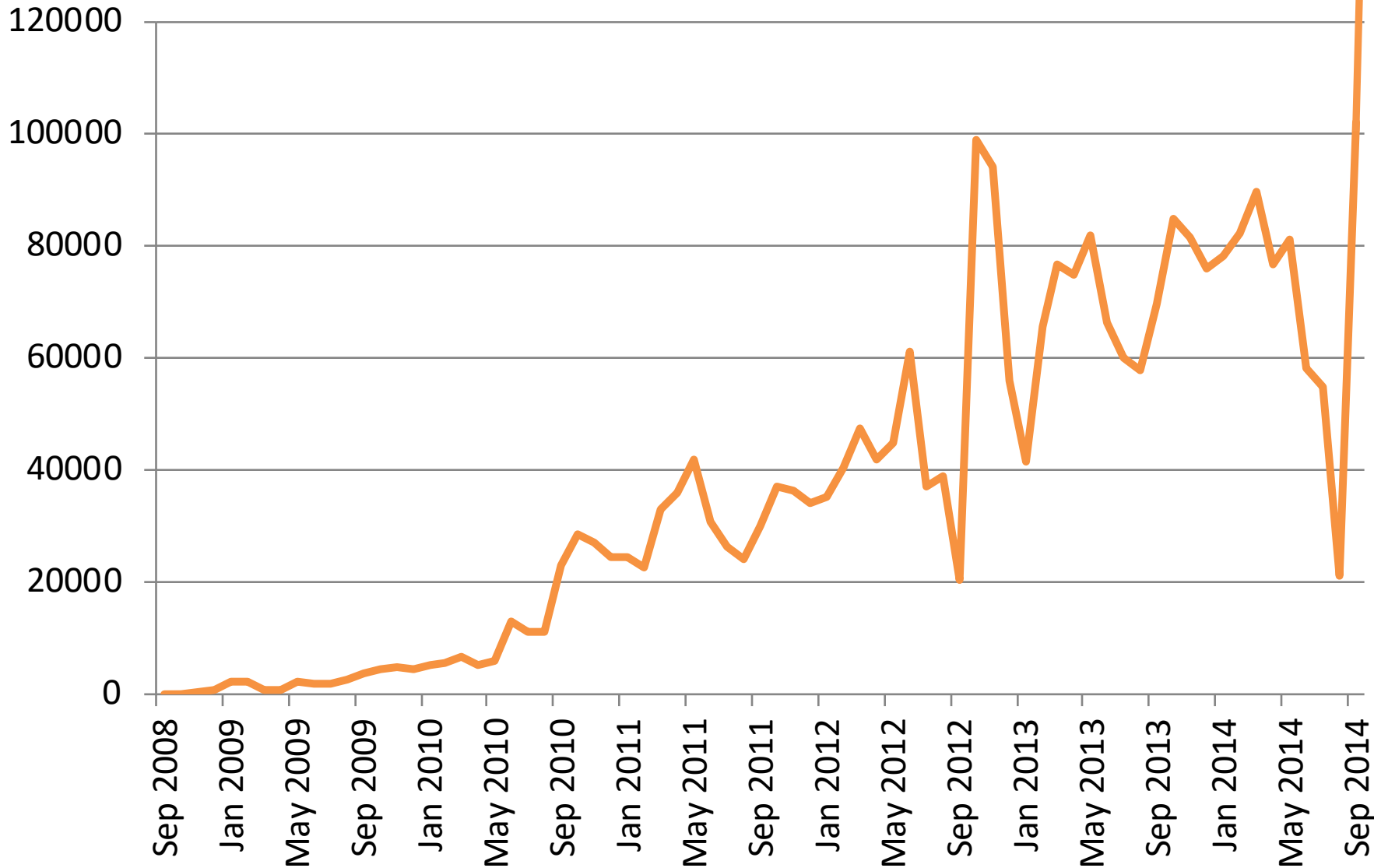

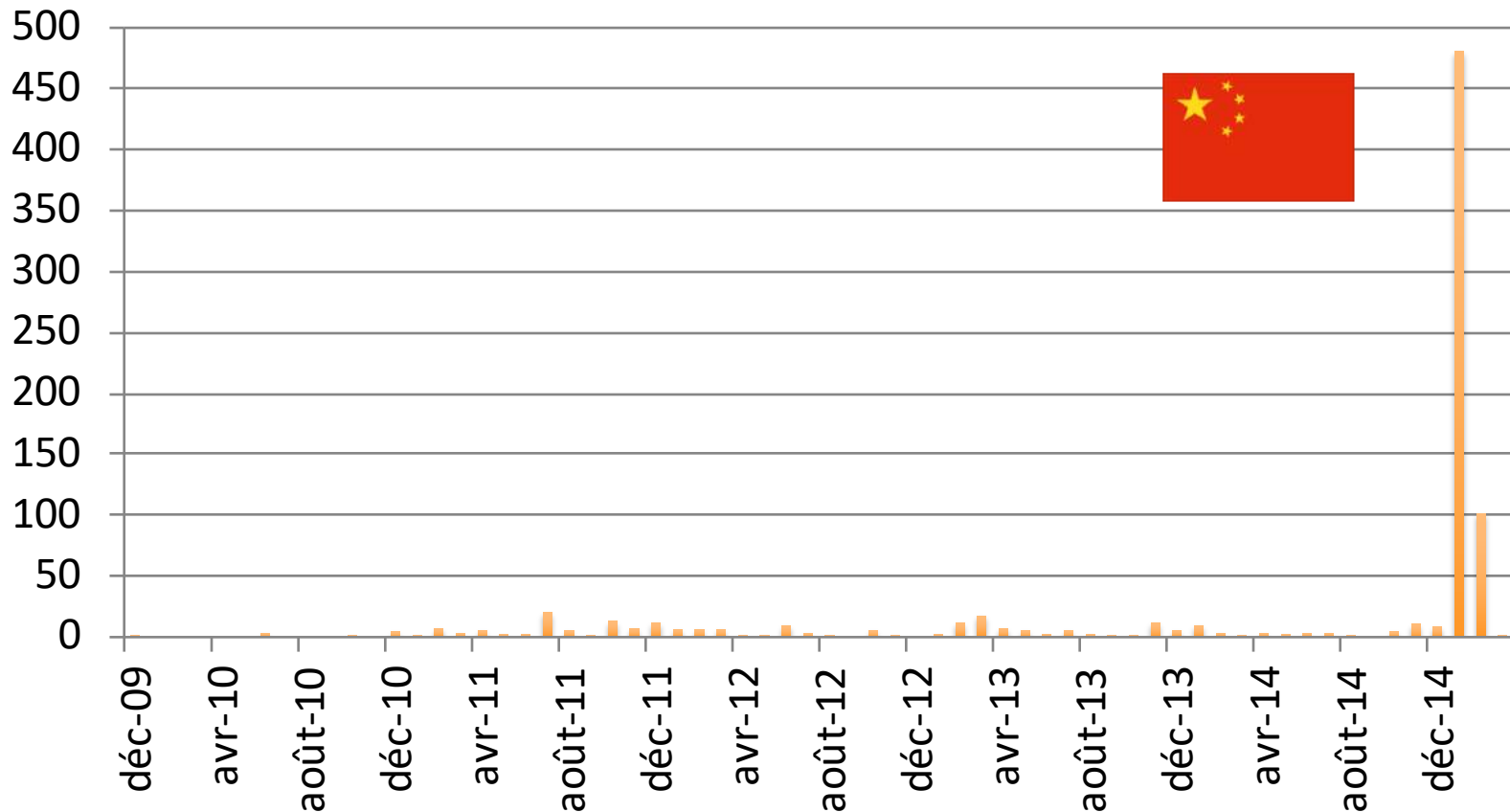


Downloads from ORBi (2008 to September 2018)

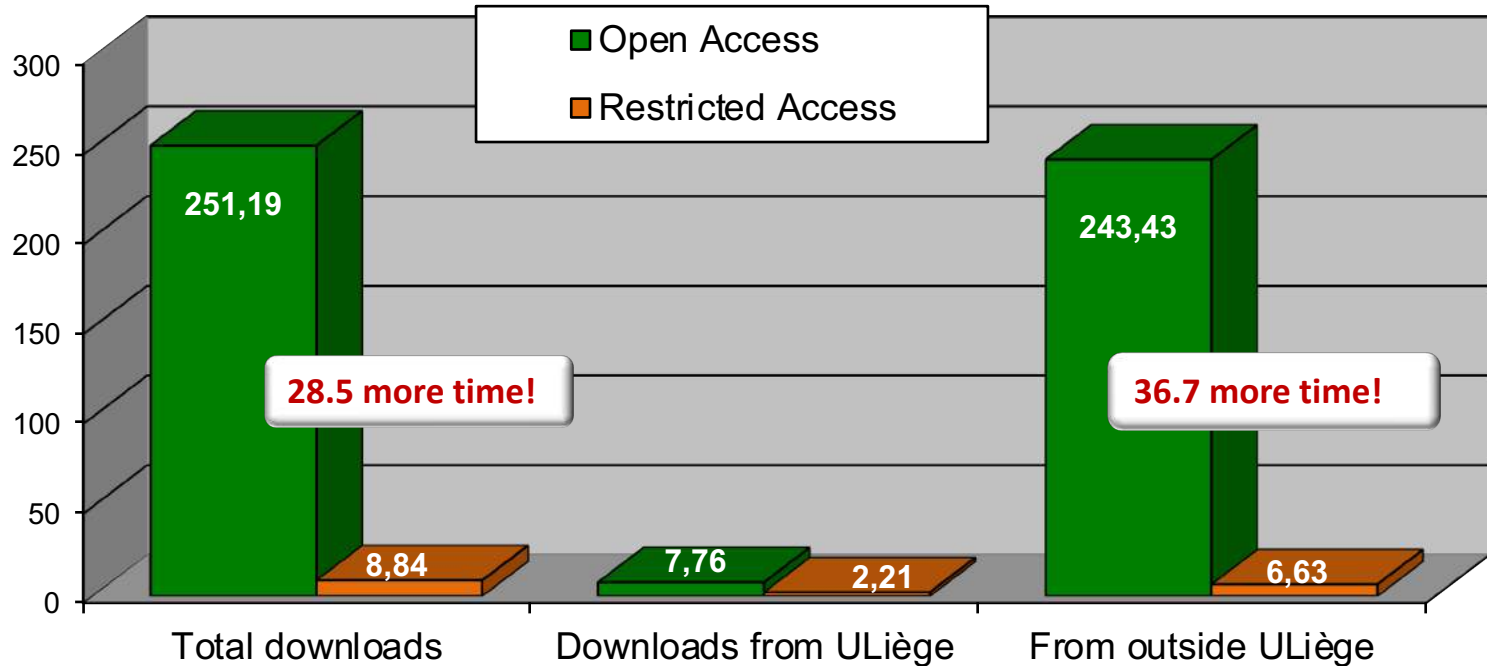
Evolution of monthly download for the paper

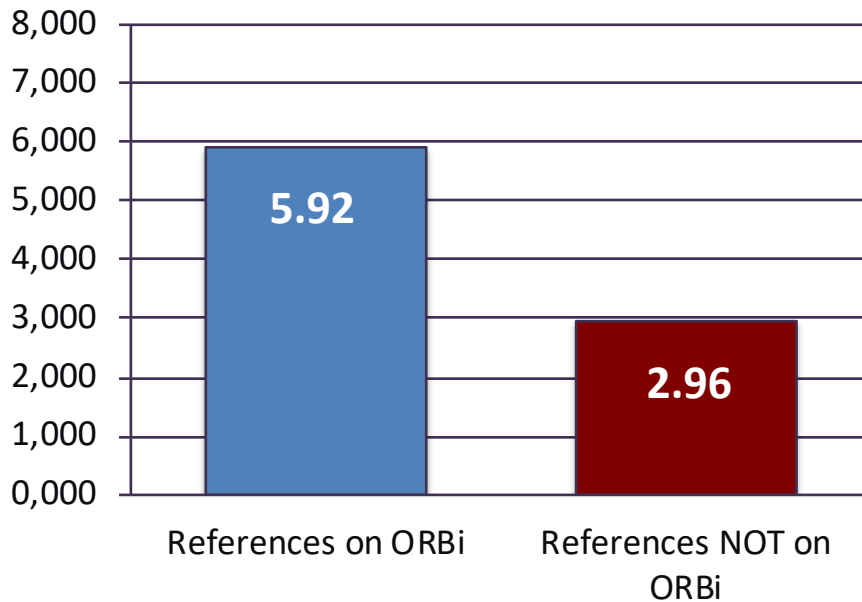
Mean number of downloads for references 2010-2016
(Measured October 2017 on 7,411,495 downloads of 51,397 references with FT)



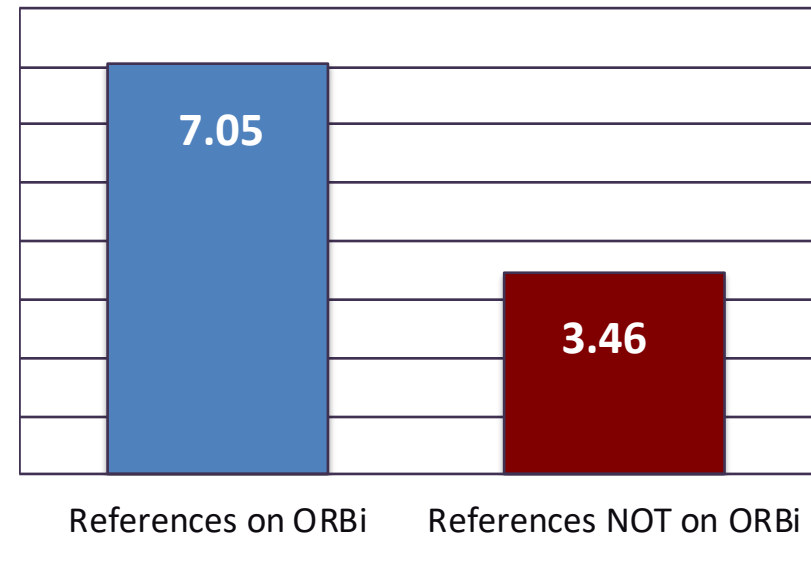

According to Web of Science, the part of ULIège publications WITHOUT any citations for 2007-2011:

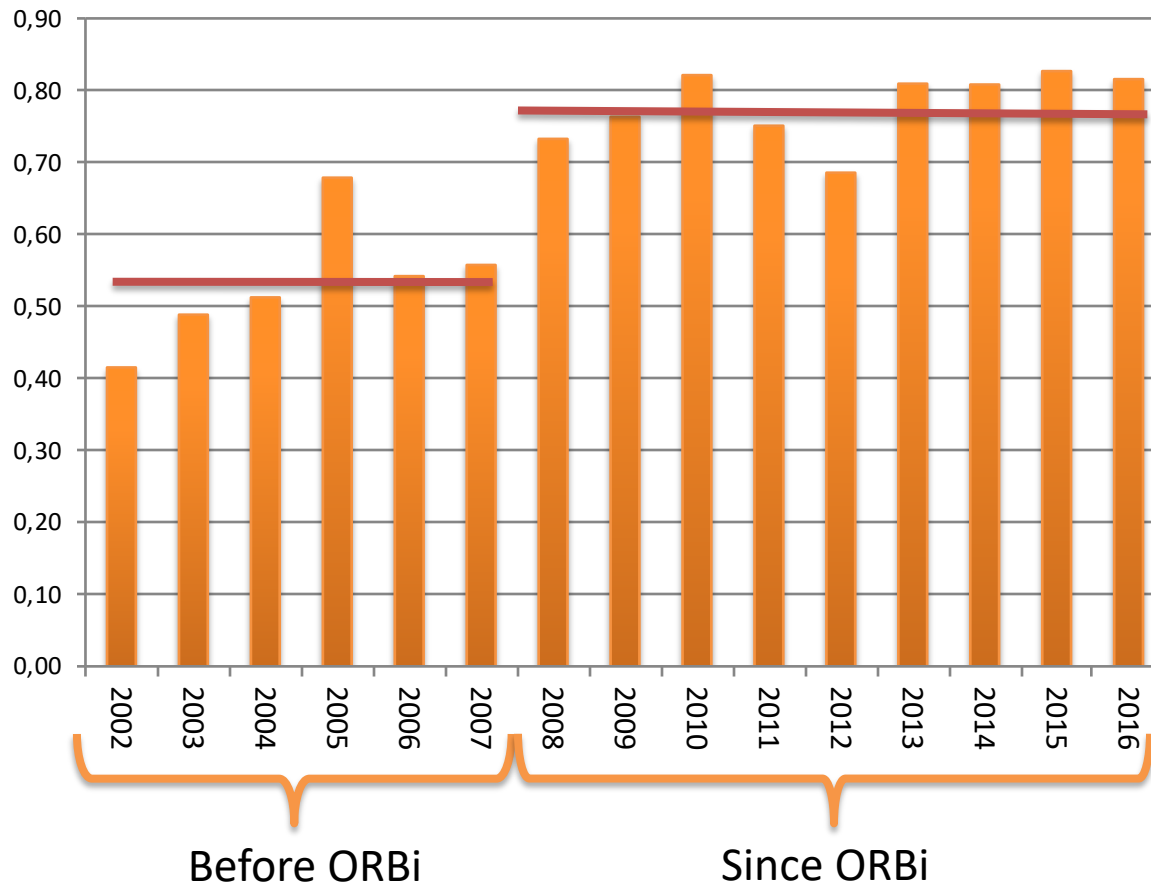
- If on ORBi: **28.9%**

(Scopus 11-28-2017)



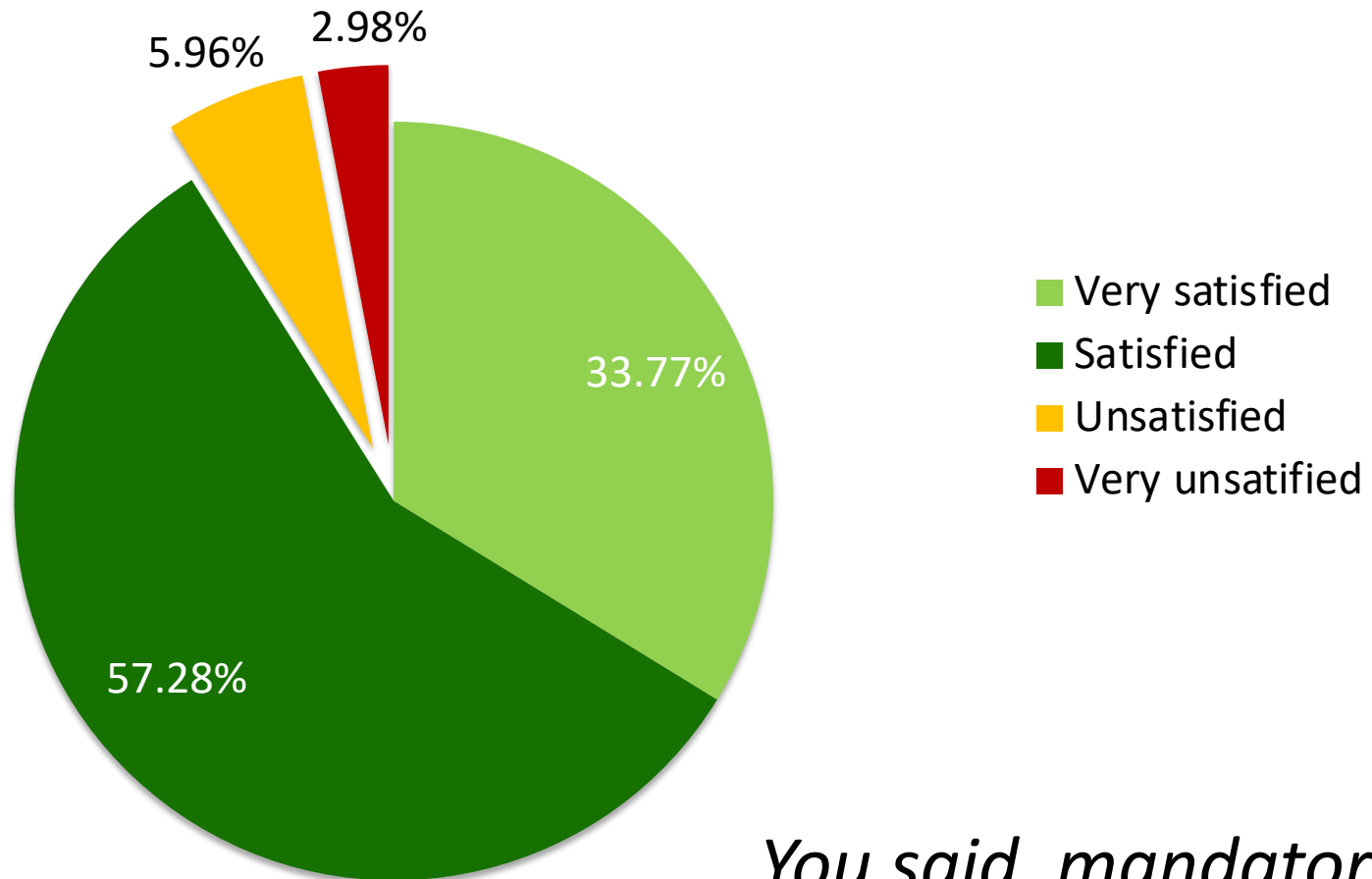

- ▶ Very important recent evolution of Belgian law
 - May 2018: OA decree of Wallonia-Brussel federation (FWB)
 - July 2018: modification of Federal law on copyright

OA decree of Wallonia-Brussel Federation (FWB)



May 2018

Very similar to ULiège mandate (😊) and even one step more

- ▶ If funded totally or partially by Wallonia-Brussel federation, researchers have to deposit in a IR the published FT version (author postprint) of ALL their journal articles
- ▶ As soon as accepted (thus before publication)
- ▶ Immediate OA or, if required by contract with publishers, with max 6 months (STM) or 12 months (SSH) embargo
- ▶ During embargo: “request a print” procedure
- ▶ For all evaluation procedures in FWB, only the lists coming from IR will be taken into consideration
- ▶ Monitoring of APC evolution in FWB
- ▶ Coming into force: academic year 2018-2019





Modification of Federal law on copyright

July 2018

- ▶ For research financed at least ½ by public funds
- ▶ In Belgium, authors of scientific journal articles retain the right to deposit in OA the published FT version (author postprint)
- ▶ With max 6 months (STM) or 12 months (SSH) embargo (if required by contract with publishers)
- ▶ Even if they gave up their copyright to the publisher
- ▶ This right is imperative. Not possible to give it up
