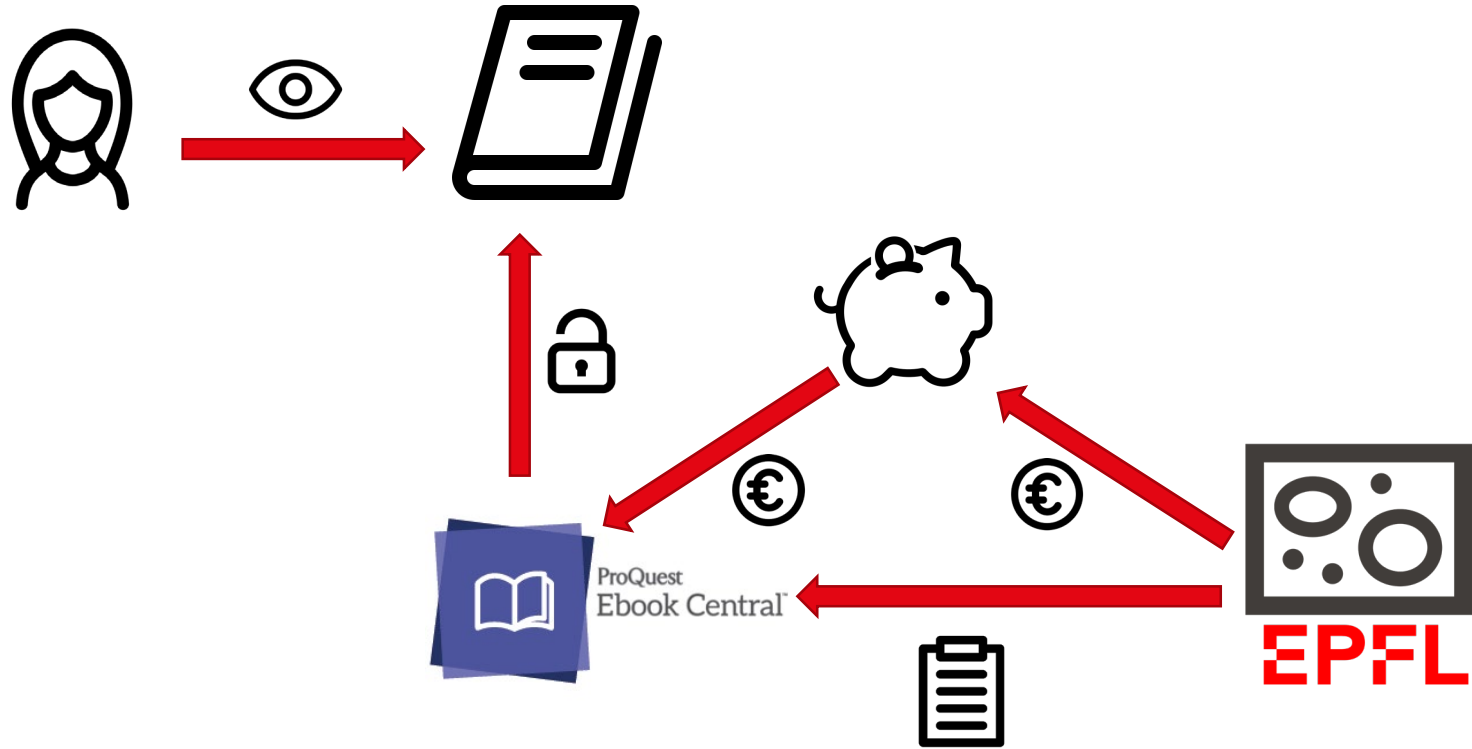




Patron driven acquisition

- Patron driven acquisition (PDA) or Demand driven acquisition (DDA)
- The purchase of a title is triggered by the usage (download, reading time) of the title.
- Started in 2019 for a one year test (sep 2019 - sep 2020)
- Budget : ~**8K** CHF/ year
- Size : ~**30K** titles

PDA Workflow



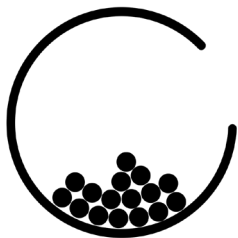
Advantages and drawbacks



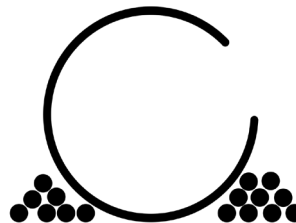
- Immediate access for users
- Minimum 1 usage guaranteed
- Selection by the users
- Time saving once the system is setup
- Automatic addition of titles in the discovery tool



- No control (if mediation disabled)
- Subjects too broad
- Higher prices for less access
- DRM



- Copyright, creation and publication date : after 2018
- Price : 25-175 EUR
- Language : French and English
- 30 subjects in relation with our collection development policy



- Direct providers
- Subjects : Fiction and Juvenile literature

- Analysis of the acquisitions during the test
- Change of ILS from Aleph to Alma

Enhancement of the profile

- Moving wall 3 previous years
- Price : max 200 EUR
- Subjects : 9 deleted, 6 added

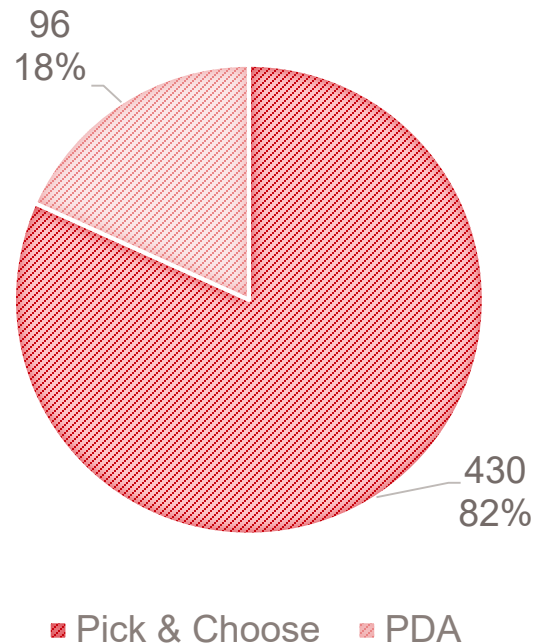

Usage PDA vs P&C (Proquest Ebook Central)

- PDA : 114 titles used in 2021 out of 220 purchased : **52%**
- P&C : 75 titles used in 2021 out of 247 purchased : **30%**

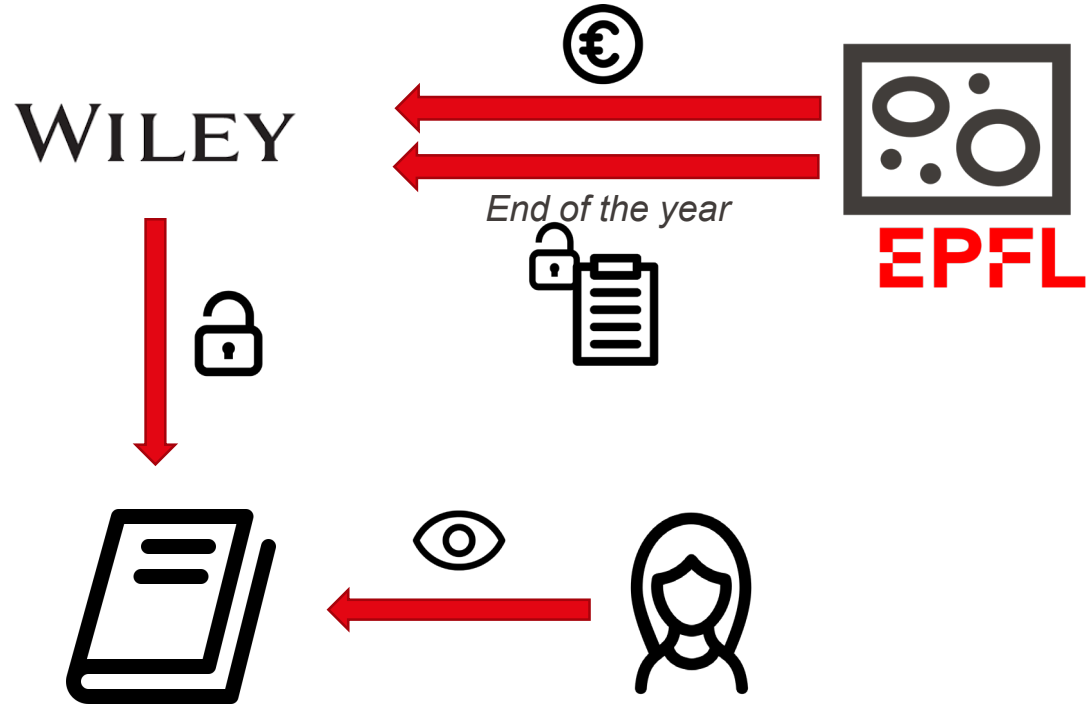
- **30K** titles available to users
- Need for monitoring and adjustments
- More usage than other purchase models
- Good complementarity with purchases selected by liaison librarians
- Almost **20%** of single title purchases (no package or frontlist)





Evidence based acquisition

- Evidence based acquisition (EBA) or Evidence based selection (EBS)
- Titles are selected at the end of the year by the electronic librarian, with consultation of liaison librarians.
- Started in 2021 with two publishers (Wageningen & Wiley)
- Test with Wiley due to the price increase of the Chemistry Frontlist
- Budget : **25K** EUR for 2021



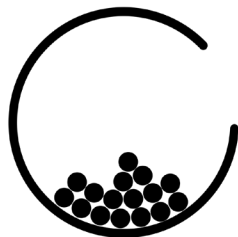
Advantages and drawbacks



- Lots of titles available
- Acquisition based on usage
- Time saving for liaison librarians

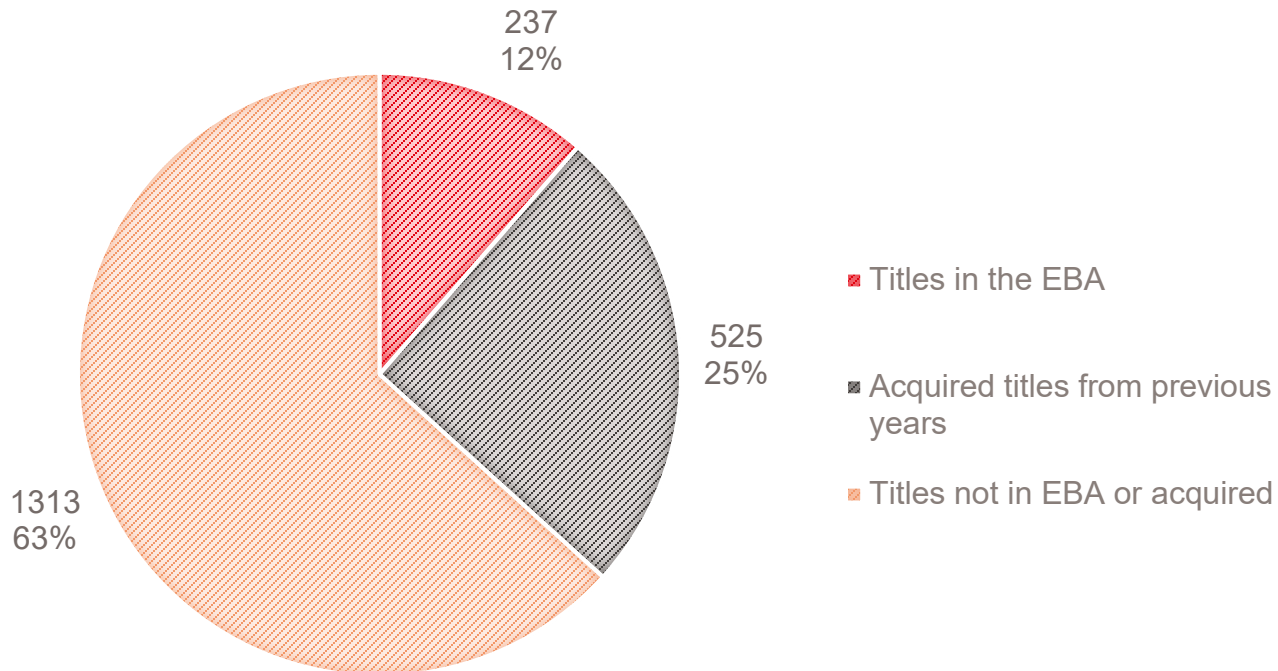


- Price of the titles
- No custom amount and/or collections (some Vendors may offer more flexible options)
- Time consuming for e-librarians

- EBA : 237 titles used in 2021 out of ~2200 : **10.4%**

Titles selected by :

- Selection from the Chemistry librarian
- Used at least 1 time and reported during the year by liaison librarians
- High usage during the year
- Publication Year
- High denied access (titles not included in the EBA program)

- **121** titles selected (73 part of the EBA program)
- EBA Wiley renewed in 2022 with 10 years of CY + new EBA with IOP

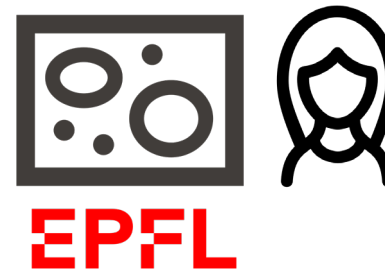
- **+2K** titles available to users
- Chemistry is not the most used subject
- The most used titles are not always the most recent
- **63%** of the accessed titles were neither in the EBA pool nor in acquired collections
- Usage based selection needs a lot of analysis, not only of used EBA titles
- Time consuming for the e-librarian
- For the future:
 - use EBA as a one-time way to meet the needs of our users not covered by the selections of liaison librarians
 - favour the most flexible EBAs



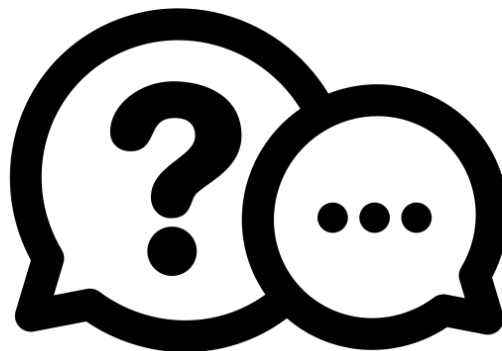
Beyond the library collection

For our Users and the Library

- + **32K** titles available in 2021
- Almost **50K** titles in 2022
- No need to buy the titles used during the EBA
- Short Term Loans available for the PDA
- Some publishers are only available via Ebook Central
- Invisible for our users



- Good complement to traditional acquisition models
- Evolution of our acquisition methods ?
