The birth of Early English Books Online




- 147,320 titles (115 added in Dec 2023)
- 17 million plus pages
- Over 80 years to scan and produce microfilm & metadata + MARC
- 98% complete (ESTC)
- Approx. 2000 titles in ESTC still to be digitized
- 1000 titles in pipeline from microfilm
- We add between 200-500 new works every year (CSF)
- USTC Classifications (incl Women in Publishing)
- Black & white
- English language
- 220 ++ source libraries
- 150 TCP partners 16 years to transcribe
- 60,000 TCP texts 41% of total EEBO titles










The birth of Early European Books



The main stages of collaboration

Obtaining the licence

Selecting suppliers (usually a large number)

Providing expertise in digitisation - on site and elsewhere

Enabling different workflow processes

Recognising and respecting cultural differences

Working with institutions with very different operating methods For example: categorising content: Index Clement BnF, UCL Judaica

Early European Books - the production challenges"

Handling of books:


- Fragile and precious objects must be handled with care.
- Scanning: Pages must be turned manually.
- Books come in many different sizes. Some pages are folded (fold-out).
- Some books have a very tight binding (a prism is used to open the books at 45°).
- It is necessary to photograph the spine and the edges of the pages.

Metadata:


- They must be able to report page numbers, maps, portraits and marginalia.
- Cataloguing, including information about the copy in n different languages



Mapping the status of women in publishing



A new USTC classification subject



There is no catalogue of female voices in the early modern era. EEB has added this classification subject - all female writers, printers, editors and characters are searchable.

Early Modern Books « women in publishing » ()

Author/Printer/Editor

Gender marking is based on: the title page, the imprint or information about the printer.

Labelling:

Widow: woman running a printing business after the death of her husband. **Heir**: child or apprentice of the printer who inherits the business: unstable category - requires careful research.

The 'Women in Publishing' tag hopes to avoid being reductive and instead represents the complexity of gendered lives.






